Ellen Whyte is a regional headliner out of Portland, Oregon that was voted 1997's Best Female Vocalist and Album of the Year for her album "Different Point of Blue" by the Cascade Blues Association.

Ellen Whyte will open the evening and be doing cuts from her new CD, "Here & Gone."

The Charles White Band is a Seattle regional headliner with a seven member band and horn section cranking out high energy rhythm and blues.

Considered to have the moves of James Brown and Sammy Davis Jr., White never touches an instrument but the mic. It is said if you can't dance to White's music, check into the morgue, because you must be dead.
