There's a hot blues happening this weekend, Saturday, December 11, 1999, at the Wenatchee Center Grand Ballroom.

Besides having the opportunity to hear some good blues this weekend, the performances will also benefit a good cause--proceeds will benefit Generations And Partnerships (GAP), a non-profit, all-volunteer organization that helps seniors and disabled people remain independent.

Blues diva "Ellen Whyte" and "Charlie Butts and the Filter Tips" will be performing live in the second presentation of the 1999-2000 Concert Series by Robert Sandidge of R.L.S. Entertainment Enterprises.

Whyte, who performed in Wenatchee last year, will be performing with "Reflex Blue"-- a Portland-area band that has received high-enough praise to be nominated for a Grammy.



Because the show is a benefit, it is the highest-priced show of the five R.L.S. shows to be presented this year with ticket prices ranging from \$20 in advance to \$24 at the door.

Also, for the first time, entire tables can be reserved for \$200 for a 10-seat table. Table reservations can be made directly through promoter Robert Sandidge by calling 509-662-6872. Sandidge has a table chart which shows ticket-buyers exactly where their table will be. Up to 40 tables will be reserved prior to the performance with the

remaining seating being festival seating on a first-come, first-served basis.
