## **R.L.S. benefit show a week away**

The second show in the R.L.S. Entertainment Enterprises 1999-2000 Concert Series — and the most important, since it will benefit a worthy cause — is a week and a half away.

The Dec. 11 blues show at the Wenatchee Center's Grand Ballroom will feature Ellen Whyte and Reflex Blue — a Portland-area band that has garnered some nomination votes for the Grammy Awards — and Charlie Butts and the Filter Tips, an Idaho group that should be no stranger to Central Washington blues buffs.

Of the five R.L.S. shows, this

show will be the ticket-priciest at \$20 in advance, \$24 at the door — but for a good reason. Proceeds will benefit Generations And Partnerships (GAP), a non-profit, all-volunteer organization that helps seniors and disabled people remain independent.

Because of this benefit concept, this is the only R.L.S. show of the season at which ticket-buyers can reserve entire tables. They can be reserved — at \$200 for the 10-seat table — directly from promoter Robert Sandidge, who has a table chart so buyers can see precisely which table will be theirs. As many as 40 tables will be reserved prior to the show. Those left will be festival (first-come, first-served) seating.
